You know I have to write my monthly pastor letter a couple of weeks early, right? Well, July, so far, has been a really long year. How can I possibly address August? My colleagues have been talking about having to re-write their sermons weekly! What more can happen?! Lots! Or nothing. Or... something wonderful?

Some days we just have to say to ourselves breath in, breath out. Right foot. Left foot. Go up a mountain. Go wander the woods.

For our own sakes, we must "keep our peace". Think about that in all its different layers. If we are anxious and worried, we have "misplaced" our inner peace. Not only can that actually affect our health, it's hard to be an emissary for the Prince of Peace if we do not allow ourselves to be comforted and stilled by God's nearness. Go sit by a stream. Go listen to the birds.

After that, for others' sakes, and for the sake of the kingdom, we must "keep our peace". Breath in, breath out. Others are entitled to their opinions, but as my dad used to say, "You don't have to go to every fight you're invited to." Go walk in the park. Go find a dog to pet or a baby to hold.

"Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on thee" (*Isaiah 26:3KJV*).

Therefore, "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus" (*Philippians 4:6-7*).

Now, "may the Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you; the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace." (*Numbers* 6:24-26).

The second book is a Newberry Honor Book entitled Where The Mountain *Meets The Moon* by Grace Lin.







VIRGINIA SALES TAX HOLIDAY RETURNING IN AUGUST

RICHMOND, Va. (WRIC) — Virginia's three-day sales tax holiday is returning this August, just in time for the parents of students across the state to be sent a long list of school supplies for the fall.

According to the Virginia Department of Taxation, this year's sales tax holiday will begin at 12:01 a.m. on **Friday, Aug. 2** and end at 11:59 p.m. on **Sunday, Aug. 4**. The following items will be exempt from sales tax during the holiday:

- School supplies, clothing, and footwear
 - Qualified school supplies \$20 or less per item
 - Qualified clothing and footwear \$100 or less per item

• Hurricane and emergency preparedness products

- Portable generators \$1,000 or less per item
- Gas-powered chainsaws \$350 or less per item
- Chainsaw accessories \$60 or less per item
- Other specified hurricane preparedness items \$60 or less per item
- Energy Star[™] and WaterSense[™] products
 - Qualifying Energy Star[™] or WaterSense[™] products purchased for noncommercial home or personal use – \$2,500 or less per item

More information about what school supplies, clothing and appliances qualify for the sales tax holiday can be found on the department's website <u>(www.tax.virginia.gov/virginia-sales-tax-holiday)</u>.

The August sales tax holiday was not included in Virginia's state budget for 2023, but
legislators were able to move it to October of that year. In 2024, the House of Dele gates unanimously passed a bill to bring back the sales tax holiday.
